PARK BENCH THEFT AT O'CALLAGHAN PARK

Gardai are appealing for witnesses following the theft of a wooden bench from O'Callaghan Park.

The incident likely happened in broad daylight at around 5pm on Sunday, August 23rd.

This is the first recorded occurrence of bench theft in Glanmire, which follows on from recent stolen benches in Glenville and an entire picnic bench from Macroom that still remains missing.

"A male, wearing a Von Dutch baseball cap, tee shirt and shorts picked up a large wooden bench from the grounds of O'Callaghan Park and walked out onto the

Old Youghal Road. He turned left in the direction of Meadowbrook Estate," said hard crime prevention officer Sergeant Ger Stack.

Gardai attached to Glanmire station are investigating the theft and are begging for any witnesses to come forward.

"As there would have been a fair bit of passing traffic and people would've been out walking that there may be witnesses to the unusual sight of a man carrying a large bench walking out of and then adjacent to John O'Callaghan Park," said Sgt Stack.

(HAY FEVER)

This year has been a particularly bad year for Hay Fever sufferers in Ireland. 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ANCIENT NATIVE AMERICAN BURIAL GROUND IN GLANMIRE?

For decades it has been rumoured that the site on which Billy Meaney's shop once stood was at one time a Native American burial ground, and then sometime later, an ancient Native American burial ground. 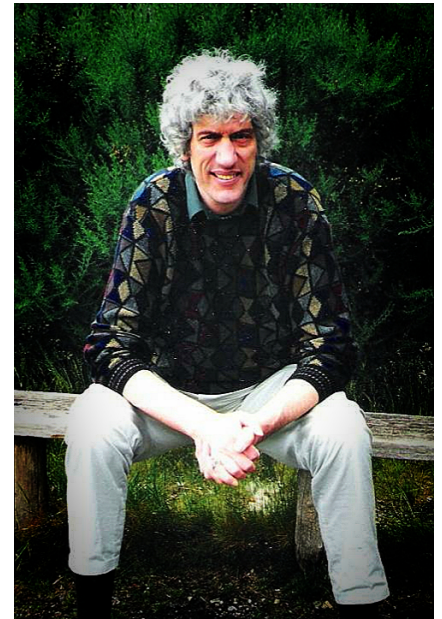

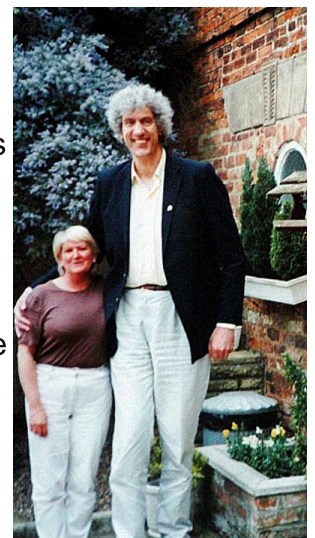


Geoff, official giant

Geoff and Allison in their heyday

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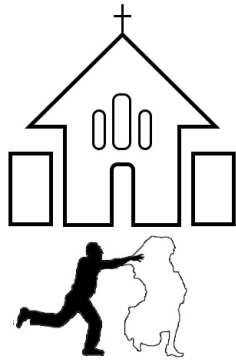

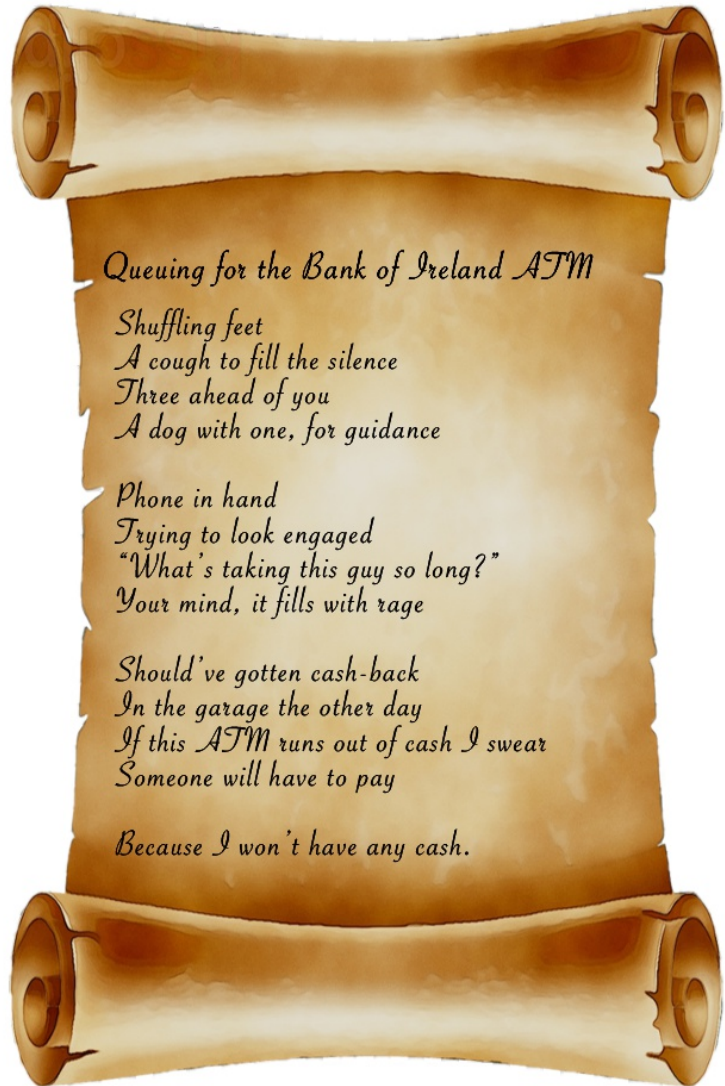

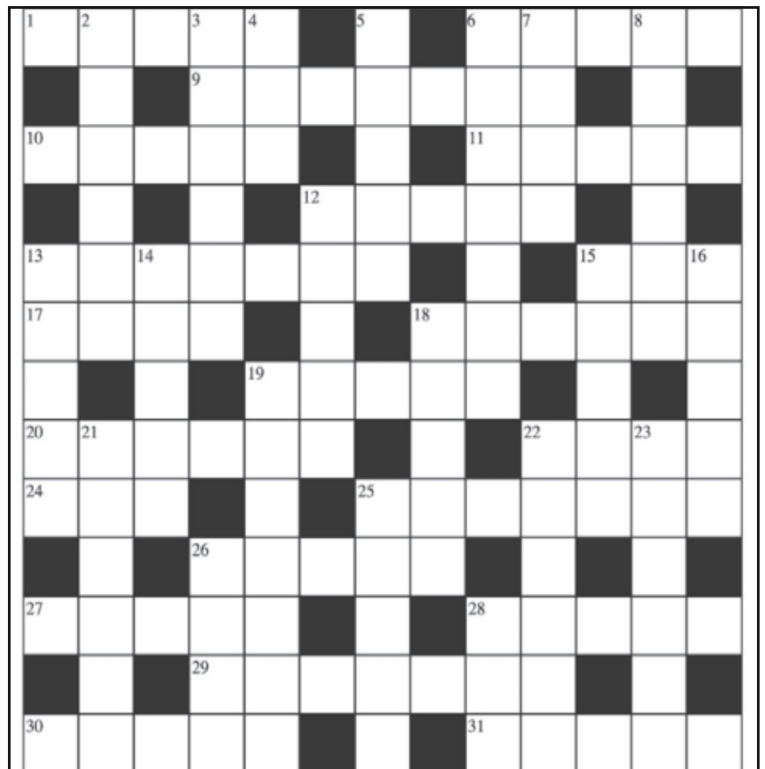
